The Living History Project

Navan Travellers Workshops Ltd have re-created a real life picture of Traveller life in the 1950's. The scene includes a fully restored Barrel Top Wagon, a traditional tent, a flat cart, working tin-smith, story telling Traveller woman and of course, a camp-fire.

Navan Travellers Workshops and Meath County Library Services have teamed up to open a Library Service in St. Patrick's Park. The library offers reading activities and is open to anyone interested in reading, borrowing books, doing homework and getting information on various research topics. The library is open to kids and adults alike and arts & crafts activities are organised for children every week.

Childcare and Youth Activites

We are very proud of our education and youth services programme. NTW Ltd provides programmes for children aged from 3 years to 16 years.



Pre-School

"Little Angels" Pre-School caters for both Traveller and settled children in the 3-5 year age group It is a well-run and wellequipped facility and is a Traveller led pre-school which strives for an ethos of equality.



After-school

"The Little Angels" after-school runs from 2pm to 6pm, Monday to Friday for primary school children. The children in our care are supported by a full childcare team. The children get a hot dinner, a snack and help with their homework. We also run a wide variety of activities such as arts and crafts and games.

Youth Group

"The Glitter Girls" youth group is for girls aged between 11 and 16 years. The group meet weekly, go on trips and complete courses. The boys enjoy soccer and have called their team the Navan Town Wanderers as the jerseys say NTW

Summer Project

The NTW Ltd Summer Project is running since 1983. The week of fun and sports activities for children aged from 3 to 16 years is the highlight of the year for many children in the town.

Community

NTW Ltd run several projects each year as part of our community development programme, these include an annual Traveller Christmas Mass, Christmas Card and Calendar Competition and regular trips for both adults and children to special events.



We work with as many groups in Navan as possible, sharing resources, experience and ideas. This means we reach more people on a daily basis. Some of the groups we work with include: Meath Youth Federation, Navan Community Development Project and the HSE. Working with these groups and others, Navan Travellers Workshops Ltd plays a leading role in organising such initiatives in Meath such as International Women's Day, UN Anti Poverty Day and Social Inclusion Week.

Health

Twelve Traveller women are employed as part-time health workers in the Meath Primary Healthcare Project. This project is supported by the Local Traveller Health Advisory Committee. The women provide health information and support to the local Traveller community. Our Community Development Health Worker works on many health related information and initiatives, including a quarterly Newsletter from the Project and also running health related education programmes.
